RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO ENACT LEGISLATION INCREASING THE PERSONAL EXEMPTION AND THE DEDUCTION FOR DEPENDENTS UNDER THE FEDERAL INCOME TAX LAW.

1 *Resolved*, That the General Court of Massachusetts respect-
2 fully urges the Congress of the United States to enact legis-
3 lation increasing the personal exemption, under the federal
4 income tax law from six hundred dollars to one thousand dol-
5 lars for persons under the age of sixty-five, and increasing the
6 amount of deduction allowed for dependents of such persons
7 from six hundred dollars to one thousand dollars; and be it
8 further

9 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted
10 forthwith by the secretary of the commonwealth to the Presi-
11 dent of the United States, the presiding officer of each branch
12 of the Congress, and to the members thereof from the
13 commonwealth.
