AN ACT RELATIVE TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY BENEFITS TO CERTAIN PERSONS WHO WERE UNEMPLOYED DUE TO A LABOR DISPUTE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (b) of Section 25 of Chapter 151A
2 of the General Laws, as appearing in Chapter 554 of the Acts
3 of 1959, is hereby amended by striking out paragraph (4) and
4 inserting in place thereof the following: — (4) The individual
5 has, subsequent to his unemployment because of a labor dis-
6 pute, obtained employment, and has been paid wages of not
7 less than six hundred and fifty dollars; provided, however, that
8 during the existence of such labor dispute the wages of such
9 individual used for the determination of his benefit rights shall
10 not include any wages such individual earned from the em-
11 ployer involved in such labor dispute.
