AN ACT GRANTING TENURE OF OFFICE TO CERTAIN MEDICAL
EXAMINERS AND ASSOCIATE MEDICAL EXAMINERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 38 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 1 the following section: — *Section 1A.*
3 Upon completion of a seven-year term, medical examiners and
4 associate medical examiners, if reappointed, shall hold their
5 offices during good behavior; provided, nevertheless, that the
6 governor with the consent of the council after due notice and
7 hearing may retire them because of mental or physical dis-
8 ability.
