AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE RE-ALLOCATION OF THE POSITION OF CHIEF HOSPITAL SUPERVISOR, ATTENDANT NURSE AT THE METROPOLITAN STATE HOSPITAL IN THE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The position of chief hospital supervisor, attendant nurse at
2 the Metropolitan State Hospital in the department of mental
3 health is hereby re-allocated to the position of chief hospital
4 supervisor, L.P.N. (licensed practical nurse), and shall be
5 allocated to job group XII in the general salary schedule as ap-
6 pearing in section forty-six of chapter thirty of the General
7 Laws.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

In the year 1780, the following was adopted:

ARTICLE I. The legislative power shall be vested in one House of Representatives, who shall be chosen by the people of the several counties, and shall have the sole and exclusive power of raising and appropriating money, and of regulating the trade and commerce, and of settling the public debt, and of determining the time and place of holding the general court, and of such other powers as shall be granted to them by the people.

ARTICLE II. The executive power shall be vested in a Governor, who shall be chosen by the people for a term of years, and shall have the sole and exclusive power of pardoning and commuting the punishment of criminals, and of granting reprieves, and of appointing and dismissing all officers and ministers of the State, and of such other powers as shall be granted to him by the people.

ARTICLE III. The judicial power shall be vested in a Supreme Court, and in such other courts as may be established by the Legislature, who shall have the sole and exclusive power of determining the rights of the citizens, and of settling the public debt, and of such other powers as shall be granted to them by the people.
