AN ACT REQUIRING THE REAL ESTATE REVIEW BOARD IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO STATE IN WRITING THE REASONS FOR ITS RECOMMENDATIONS RELATIVE TO THE SETTLEMENT OF LAND DAMAGE CASES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The third paragraph of section 6 of chapter 556
2 of the acts of 1952 is hereby amended by adding at the end
3 the following sentence: — Each recommendation of said real
4 estate review board shall be in writing and shall be accom-
5 panied by a written statement indicating the reasons for such
6 recommendation.

1 SECTION 2. The third paragraph of section 6 of chapter 403
2 of the acts of 1954 is hereby amended by adding at the end
3 the following sentence: — Each recommendation of said real
4 estate review board shall be in writing and shall be accom-
5 panied by a written statement indicating the reasons for such
6 recommendation.

1 SECTION 3. The third paragraph of section 6 of chapter 718
2 of the acts of 1956 is hereby amended by adding at the end the
3 following sentence: — Each recommendation of said real estate
4 review board shall be in writing and shall be accompanied by
5 a written statement indicating the reasons for such recom-
6 mendation.
