AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH ACTIVITY FEES IN STATE COLLEGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 73 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after Section 1A the following section:—
3 *Section 1B.* The board of education may fix the amount of
4 student activity fee to be paid by each student at any of the
5 state colleges and the Massachusetts college of art. All stu-
6 dent activity fees and all receipts from student activities shall
7 be retained by the president of the college in a revolving fund
8 or revolving funds, and shall be expended as the president of
9 the college may direct in furthering the activities from which
10 the fees and receipts were derived; provided that the fore-
11 going shall not authorize any action in contravention of the
12 requirements of section one of Article LXIII of the amend-
13 ments to the Constitution. The said fund or funds shall be
14 subject to annual audit by the state auditor.
