
By Mr. Umana, petition of Mario Umana for legislation to exempt from taxation the property of incorporated instrumentalities of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts of the Independent Order of Sons of Italy. Taxation.

AN ACT EXEMPTING FROM TAXATION THE PROPERTY OF INCORPORATED INSTRUMENTALITIES OF THE GRAND LODGE OF MASSACHUSETTS OF THE INDEPENDENT ORDER OF SONS OF ITALY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The real and personal property of any incor-
2 porated instrumentality of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts
3 of The Independent Order of Sons of Italy, an unincorporated
4 association, whether such instrumentality is incorporated un-
5 der the laws of the commonwealth or under the laws of any
6 other state of the United States, shall be exempt from taxa-
7 tion under the provisions of chapter fifty-nine of the General
8 Laws, so long as such property is principally and usually de-
9 voted to the educational or charitable purposes of said unin-
10 corporated association.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January first,
2 nineteen hundred and sixty-three.
