AN ACT REQUIRING THE AFFIDAVIT OF NOTICE, AND A COPY OF SAID NOTICE, IN ACTIONS FOR DEFICIENCY ON A MORTGAGE NOTE TO BE FILED IN THE REGISTRY OF DEEDS WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER FORECLOSURE SALE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 17B of chapter 244 of the General Laws, as appear-
2 ing in section 1 of chapter 604 of the acts of 1945, is hereby
3 amended by inserting after the second sentence the following
4 sentence: —

5 Said affidavit, together with a copy of said notice, shall be
6 recorded in the registry of deeds within thirty days after the
7 foreclosure sale.
