

SENATE No. 484

By Mr. Olson, petition of Florence Birmingham for legislation to prohibit fluoridation of water used in any state institution which controls and maintains the water source and supply. Public Health.

AN ACT PROHIBITING FLUORIDATION OF WATER USED IN ANY STATE INSTITUTION WHICH CONTROLS AND MAINTAINS THE WATER SOURCE AND SUPPLY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 167 the following section: —
- 3 *Section 167A.* Water used in any state institution, the
- 4 source and supply of which is maintained and controlled by
- 5 such institution, shall not be fluoridated.

2. Section 107A. Water used in any one building for the purpose of which it is maintained and controlled by such institution shall not be furnished.
