## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Three.

AN ACT MAKING A CORRECTIVE CHANGE IN THE LAW PROVIDING THAT PERSONS WHE ENTERED THE MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICES OF THE UNITED STATES DURING A CERTAIN PERIOD MAY COUNT SUCH SERVICE AS CREDITABLE FOR RETIREMENT PURPOSES.

1    *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to  
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith that certain  
3 members of retirement systems who entered the military or  
4 naval service of the United States during a certain period may  
5 count such service as creditable for purposes of retirement,  
6 therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law neces-  
7 sary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1    SECTION 1. The third subparagraph of paragraph (h) of  
2 subdivision (1) of section 4 of chapter 32 of the General Laws,  
3 as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 544 of the  
4 acts of 1962, is hereby further amended by striking out the  
5 second sentence and inserting in place thereof the following  
6 sentence: — The provisions of sections nine and nine A of  
7 chapter seven hundred and eight of the acts of nineteen hun-  
8 dred and forty-one, as amended, and as may be further  
9 amended, shall be applicable to any person referred to in sec-  
10 tion one of said chapter seven hundred and eight who is a  
11 member of any retirement system established under the pro-  
12 visions of this chapter whose last discharge or release from  
13 military service was under honorable conditions as defined in  
14 defense department regulations.

1    SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of July first, nine-  
2 teen hundred and sixty-two.
