AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD MAY BORROW FOR OFF-STREET PARKING FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 242 of the acts of 1958 is
2 hereby amended by striking out the second sentence, as
3 amended by section 1 of chapter 512 of the acts of 1962, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentence:— Said city
5 may, for the purposes of this act, borrow from time to time
6 within a period of six years from the passage of this act such
7 sums as may be necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate
8 one million dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor
9 which shall bear on their face the words, City of New Bed-
10 ford, Public Parking Loan, Act of 1958.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE TERRITORY OF KANSAS, AND TO DEFINE THE OFFICE AND DUTIES OF THE GOVERNORS AND JUDGES OF THE SAME.

SECTION 1. The Governor and Judges of the Territory of Kansas shall be elected by the people of the Territory at the same time and place as the electors of the State of Kansas shall elect their representatives in the General Assembly of the State of Kansas.

SECTION 2. The Governor shall hold office for the term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election. He shall be elected on the first day of January next after the day of the election of the representatives in the General Assembly of the State of Kansas. He shall have the honor and precedence of a Governor of a State. He shall be sworn to the office of his office before he enters upon his office.
