AN ACT PERMITTING A WIDOW OR LEGAL REPRESENTATIVE OF A DECEASED EMPLOYEE TO FILE A CLAIM FOR WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION AND TO PROCEED WITH A CLAIM NOTWITHSTANDING THE DEATH OF THE EMPLOYEE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 49 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by section 6 of chapter 314 of the acts of
3 1953, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof
4 the following two sentences:— Failure of an employee to
5 file claim for compensation during his lifetime shall not bar
6 his widow, widower, or if none, his legal representative from
7 making such claim in accordance with this chapter. Death
8 of the employee who has filed claim for compensation shall
9 not bar his widow or widower, or if none, his legal representa-
10 tive from proceeding hereunder.
