AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CLASSIFICATION OF
DISTRICT COURT CLERKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 That the Clerk of The Fourth District County be placed
- 2 in Class Five and that the Clerk shall devote his entire time
- 3 during the ordinary business hours to his respective duties
- 4 and shall not directly or indirectly engage in the practice of
- 5 Law.

3 during the ordinary term of his respective office
4 and shall not thereby be indirectly engaged in the practice of
