AN ACT PLACING THE POSITION OF DOG OFFICER-GAME WARDEN IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN THE TOWN OF FALMOUTH UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The position of Dog Officer-Game Warden in
2 the police department in the town of Falmouth shall be sub-
3 ject to the civil service laws and rules. The tenure of office
4 of any incumbent thereof shall be unlimited, subject, however,
5 to said laws and rules, and provided he passes a qualifying
6 examination to be given by the Division of Civil Service. If
7 he passes said examination, he shall be deemed to be perma-
8 nently appointed thereto without being required to serve any
9 probationary period.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance
2 by the town of Falmouth.
