The Committee on Bills in the Third Reading, to whom was referred the House Bill extending the time within which certain soldiers and sailors and their wives, widows, fathers and mothers may file applications for abatement or exemption of taxes (House, No. 2049), reports recommending that the same be amended by substituting therefor a new draft entitled "An Act extending the time within which soldiers and sailors and their wives, widows, fathers and mothers may file applications for certain abatements or exemptions of taxes levied in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three" (Senate, No. 588), and that, when so amended, the same will be correctly drawn.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Four.

AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH SOLDIERS AND SAILORS AND THEIR WIVES, WIDOWS, FATHERS AND MOTHERS MAY FILE APPLICATIONS FOR CERTAIN ABATEMENTS OR EXEMPTIONS OF TAXES LEVIED IN THE YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SIXTY-THREE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Application for abatement or exemption, as provided in  
2 clauses Twenty-second, Twenty-second A, Twenty-second B  
3 and Twenty-second C of section five of chapter fifty-nine of  
4 the General Laws of taxes levied in the year nineteen hun-  
5 dred and sixty-three may be made not later than October  
6 first, nineteen hundred and sixty-four, notwithstanding any  
7 provision of law to the contrary.
