AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF WINTHROP OF THE QUESTION OF THE REVOCATION OF ITS ACCEPTANCE OF THE TENEMENT HOUSE LAW, SO CALLED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 There shall be submitted to the voters of the town of
2 Winthrop at its annual town meeting in the year nineteen
3 hundred and sixty-four the following question, which shall
4 be printed upon the official ballot used for the election of town
5 officers at said meeting: — “Shall the town of Winthrop re-
6 voke its acceptance of chapter six hundred and thirty-five
7 of the acts of nineteen hundred and twelve, being an act rela-
8 tive to tenement houses in towns?” If a majority of the votes
9 in answer to said question is in the affirmative, the provisions
10 of chapter one hundred and forty-five of the General Laws
11 shall not apply in said town. Nothing herein contained shall
12 prevent said town from again accepting the provisions of said
13 chapter one hundred and forty-five after the revocation of its
14 acceptance thereof.
