AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TENURE OF OFFICE OF THOMAS B.
CUMMINGS, DEPUTY RECORDER OF THE LAND COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
2 Thomas B. Cummings, deputy recorder of the Land Court,
3 may continue to serve as deputy recorder of the Land Court
4 after reaching the age of seventy and until such time as he
5 or the judge of the Land Court may determine. Upon the
6 termination of his office by resignation or otherwise, said
7 Thomas B. Cummings shall be entitled to receive the same
8 retirement benefits to which he would have been entitled had
9 he retired upon reaching age seventy.
