AN ACT REGULATING TRANSPORTATION OF BOVINE ANIMALS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 36B of chapter 129 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by section 1 of chapter 72 of the acts of  
3 1965, is hereby further amended by striking out the last two  
4 sentences and inserting in place thereof the following two  
5 sentences: — It shall be unlawful for a person to transport or  
6 offer for transportation any unvaccinated bovine animal under  
7 six months of age, and any vaccinated bovine animal over  
8 eight months that has been tested for brucellosis and has  
9 acted positively to such tests, except cattle moved by permit  
10 issued by state or federal inspectors. Any person, firm or  
11 corporation who buys, sells or transports any cattle known  
12 to be positive to an approved test for brucellosis, except animals  
13 under eight months of age and accompanied by a certificate  
14 of vaccination, or except animals for immediate slaughter,  
15 shall be fined not more than two hundred dollars for each  
16 animal bought, sold or transported.

#### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRANSPORTATION BY RAILROADS

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Congress  
at Washington, D. C., on the 14th day of February, 1905.

1. Section 3581 of chapter 353 of the Federal Code as now
2. in force amended by section 1 of chapter 17 of the Act of
3. 1902, is hereby further amended by adding to the last two
4. sentences and inserting in their stead the following two
5. sentences:—It shall be unlawful for a person to transport or
6. offer for transportation any live animal unless such
7. live animal is kept in any enclosed bagging material over
8. eight months that has been tested for freedom and has
9. been positively found to be free from any disease of pests.
10. In event of any such disease or pest the person who
11. transports such live animal shall be liable for the same.
12. It is to be further provided that the Secretary of Agriculture
13. under such conditions of use and cooperation as a certificate
14. of vaccination is hereby authorized for immediate shipment.
15. It shall be deemed that more than two hundred dollars for each
16. animal is to be paid for transportation.
