**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN MEDICINE TO REGISTER AS A QUALIFIED PHYSICIAN ELMO PONSDOMENECH OF NEWTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section three of chapter  
2 one hundred and twelve of the General Laws, the board of  
3 registration in medicine may register as a physician, Elmo  
4 Ponsdomenech of Newton; provided, that the said Elmo  
5 Ponsdomenech shall pass such qualifying examination as said  
6 board in its discretion deems proper, and that said Elmo  
7 Ponsdomenech shall meet all the requirements of section two  
8 of said chapter one hundred and twelve, and provided that said  
9 board shall determine that the said Elmo Ponsdomenech is  
10 qualified to practice medicine in the commonwealth, having in  
11 mind his prior practice and experience.
