AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE CLERK OF THE FIRST
DISTRICT COURT OF NORTHERN MIDDLESEX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
