RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES RELATIVE TO CONSTRUCTING A BEACH AND RECREATION AREA WITH A SWIMMING POOL AND SKATING RINK ON THE MERRIMACK RIVER IN THE CITY OF HAVERHILL.

1    *Resolved*, That the department of natural resources is hereby  
2 authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of  
3 the subject matter of current house document numbered 1830,  
4 authorizing the department of natural resources to construct  
5 a beach and recreation area with a swimming pool and skating  
6 rink on the Merrimack river in the city of Haverhill. Said de-  
7 partment shall report to the general court the results of its in-  
8 vestigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, to-  
9 gether with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its  
10 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk  
11 of the senate on or before the last Wednesday of December,  
12 nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
