The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NUMBER OF JUSTICES IN THE SUPERIOR COURT IN PROPORTION TO THE POPULATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 212 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out section 1, as most recently amended by  
3 chapter 721 of the acts of 1962, and inserting in place thereof  
4 the following section: —

5 *Section 1.* The superior court shall have one chief justice.  
6 There shall also be one associate justice of the superior court  
7 for each one hundred thousand inhabitants or majority frac-  
8 tion thereof according to the last census authorized by law  
9 but in no event shall the number of associate justices of the  
10 superior court be less than forty-one. Not more than three  
11 associate justices shall be appointed in any single calendar year  
12 under the provisions of this act.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect March fifteenth, nine-  
2 teen hundred and sixty-seven.
