AN ACT PROVIDING THAT NO FEE SHALL BE CHARGED FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTAIN NUMBER PLATES TO AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 33 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the second paragraph, as amended by  
3 section 3 of chapter 819 of the acts of 1965, and inserting in  
4 place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 For the registration of every motor vehicle, the fee for which  
6 is not herein otherwise provided, six dollars; and for the is-  
7 suance in connection therewith, at the request of the applicant,  
8 of a distinctive initial plate, nine dollars or of a particular  
9 number plate other than a distinctive initial plate, two dollars.  
10 There shall be no fee charged for the issuance of a number  
11 plate bearing the station call letters of an amateur radio op-  
12 erator in addition to the six dollar fee charged for the regis-  
13 tration of the motor vehicle.
