The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOOL AID.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 70 of the General Laws, as most recently amended
2 by Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1966, is hereby amended by
3 striking Section 4 and inserting in place thereof the follow-
4 ing: —

5 *Section 4.* The school aid to be paid to each city and town
6 in any calendar year shall be the amount obtained by multi-
7 plying its reimbursable expenditures for the last preceding
8 fiscal year by its school aid percentage for the calendar year
9 during which such fiscal year begins; provided, however, that
10 the amount of said aid shall not be less than one hundred
11 and fifteen per cent of the amounts paid by the common-
12 wealth to each city or town in nineteen hundred and sixty-
13 five as school aid under this chapter, plus any grants and
14 reimbursements paid in such year under provisions of chap-
15 ters sixty-nine, seventy-one and seventy-four which are there-
16 after terminated. In determining the amounts paid by the
17 commonwealth in nineteen hundred and sixty-five, amounts
18 paid to regional school districts shall be deemed to have been
19 received by each city or town in such district in the same
20 proportion as the expenditures of such district which it is
21 required to pay bear to the total expenditures of such district.

SECTION 6. The Constitution of the State of Texas is amended by adding to Article I, Section 6, the following: "The Legislature shall have the power to pass laws to carry out the provisions of this Constitution."
