AN ACT PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR OPERATING A MOTORCYCLE OR
MOTOR BICYCLE ON LIMITED ACCESS HIGHWAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any person who operates a two wheel motor vehicle with
2 or without a side car attached or a bicycle with a motor or
3 driving wheel attached on a public highway to which the
4 right of access in favor of abutting land exists only at the
5 points and in such manner as determined by the common-
6 wealth, a political subdivision thereof or a public authority
7 therein shall be punished by a fine of not more than one
8 hundred dollars nor less than fifty dollars.
