AN ACT TRANSFERRING JURISDICTION OF THE TOWN OF AGAWAM FROM THE DISTRICT COURT OF SPRINGFIELD TO THE DISTRICT COURT OF WESTERN HAMPDEN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*
