By Mr. Parker (by request), a petition of John Angell for legislation to amend the law relative to the humane slaughtering of livestock by providing that the products of ritual slaughter, marketed as such, be exempt therefrom. Public Health.

AN ACT AMENDING THE ACT REQUIRING THE HUMANE SLAUGHTERING OF LIVESTOCK BY PROVIDING THAT THE PRODUCTS OF RITUAL SLAUGHTER EXEMPT FROM SUCH ACT SHALL BE SPECIFICALLY MARKETED ONLY AS SUCH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 139G of chapter 94 of the General Laws, as amended
2 by section 1 of chapter 444 of the acts of 1960, is hereby
3 amended by inserting at the end of the first sentence the fol-
4 lowing: — provided that the products of such ritual slaughter,
5 in whole and in part, are specifically marketed only as such.
