## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE SALARIES OF THE CLERKS AND ASSISTANT CLERKS OF THE SUPERIOR COURT FOR CIVIL BUSINESS AND THE SUPERIOR COURT FOR CRIMINAL BUSINESS IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, AND THE CLERKS AND ASSISTANT CLERKS OF COURTS OF THE VARIOUS COUNTIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 94 of chapter 221 of the General Laws  
2 is hereby amended by striking out all after the caption  
3 SUPERIOR COURT FOR CRIMINAL BUSINESS IN THE  
4 COUNTY OF SUFFOLK and inserting in place thereof the  
5 following: —

6 *Clerk* — a salary of twenty thousand seven hundred and  
7 fifty-seven dollars.

8 *First Assistant Clerk* — (so designated by the Clerk) — A  
9 sum equivalent to eighty per cent of the salary of the clerk.

10 *All Other Assistant Clerks* — A sum equivalent to sixty-  
11 five per cent of the salary of the clerk.

### SUPERIOR COURT FOR CIVIL BUSINESS IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK

14 *Clerk* — A salary of twenty thousand seven hundred and  
15 fifty-seven dollars.

16 *First Assistant Clerk* (so designated by the Justices of the

17 said Court) — a sum equivalent to eighty per cent of the  
18 salary of the Clerk.

19 Assistant Clerk appointed to perform the duties of Clerk  
20 pertaining to equity proceedings in said Court and designated  
21 to act as Clerk of said Court when sitting in Boston for the  
22 hearing of causes from any other County — a sum equivalent  
23 to eighty per cent of the salary of the Clerk, of which the sum  
24 of twenty-five hundred dollars shall be paid by the Common-  
25 wealth.

26 *All Other Assistant Clerks* — A sum equivalent to sixty-five  
27 per cent of the salary of the Clerk.

28 In all other Counties, the salaries of the Clerks of the Courts  
29 shall be as follows: —

30 Middlesex — Twenty thousand seven hundred and fifty-  
31 seven dollars.

32 Essex — Nineteen thousand three hundred and seventy-  
33 seven dollars.

34 Worcester — Nineteen thousand three hundred and seventy-  
35 seven dollars.

36 Hampden — Seventeen thousand nine hundred and ninety-  
37 seven dollars.

38 Bristol — Seventeen thousand nine hundred and ninety-  
39 seven dollars.

40 Norfolk — Sixteen thousand six hundred and seventeen  
41 dollars.

42 Plymouth — Fifteen thousand two hundred and thirty-  
43 seven dollars.

44 Berkshire — Twelve thousand four hundred and seventy-  
45 seven dollars.

46 Hampshire — Eleven thousand ninety-seven dollars.

47 Barnstable — Eleven thousand ninety-seven dollars.

48 Franklin — Eleven thousand ninety-seven dollars.

49 Dukes — Five thousand five hundred and seventy-seven  
50 dollars.

51 Nantucket — Five thousand five hundred and seventy-seven  
52 dollars.

53 In all Counties other than Suffolk, the Assistant Clerk shall  
54 receive a sum equivalent to eighty per cent of the Clerk, the

55 second Assistant Clerk shall receive a sum equivalent to sixty-  
56 five per cent of the salary of the Clerk, and all other Assistant  
57 Clerks shall receive a sum equivalent to sixty per cent of the  
58 salary of the Clerk.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
