## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT INSURING THAT PRACTICAL TRAINING UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF ANY REGISTERED ARCHITECT WILL QUALIFY AS THAT EXPERIENCE REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 General Laws, Chapter 112, Section 60C, as amended, is  
2 hereby further amended by the addition at the end of the  
3 second sentence thereof of the following: — “The practical  
4 training for up to eighteen months, but not less than twelve  
5 months, of the times required under (a), (b) and (c) above  
6 may be satisfied by consecutive employment under a training  
7 program approved by the board, supervised by one or more  
8 registered architects, and established by any public agency  
9 that serves as, or has the powers and performs the duties of,  
10 a planning board for a city or town under section 70 or 81A  
11 of chapter 41 of the General Laws, or by special act, and,  
12 among other functions, prepares detailed design plans for a  
13 part or parts of said city or town, and reviews and approves  
14 architectural work submitted by registered architects repre-  
15 sentative of the various types of such work listed under the  
16 definition of ‘practice of architecture’ found in section 60A  
17 hereof.”
