## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT INCREASING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE MUNICIPAL POLICE TRAINING COUNCIL, AND RELATIVE TO THE QUALIFICATIONS, POWERS AND DUTIES OF CERTAIN MEMBERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 116 of chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the first sentence, as amended by  
3 chapter 128 of the acts of 1965, and inserting in place there-  
4 of the following sentence: — There shall be a municipal po-  
5 lice training council, hereinafter called the council, to consist  
6 of the director of civil service, the commissioner of public  
7 safety, the commissioner of police of the city of Boston, or  
8 their respective designees, the special agent in charge of the  
9 Boston office of the federal bureau of investigation, if consent  
10 is given by the director of said bureau, who shall act in an  
11 advisory capacity but shall have no vote, the commissioner of  
12 education, or his designee, who shall act in an advisory ca-  
13 pacity but shall have no vote, and the chairman of the crim-  
14 inal law committee of the Massachusetts Bar Association, or  
15 his designee, who shall act in an advisory capacity but shall  
16 have no vote, and four members to be appointed by the gov-  
17 ernor, three of whom shall be chiefs of police who shall be  
18 selected from a list of six nominees submitted by the board of  
19 directors of the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association,  
20 Inc., and one of whom shall be a member of the Massachu-  
21 setts Police Association, who shall be selected from two nom-  
22 inees submitted by the board of directors of said association.
