# Population Movements In The Massachusetts Department of Correction During 1983

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#### Introduction

The population movement report is one of seven annual statistical reports regularly produced by the Research Unit of the Massachusetts Department of Correction. Each correctional facility of the Department of Correction submits weekly admission and release reports describing in detail each offender move into or out of that facility. This annual movement report is a compilation of all admissions and releases during 1983. It presents information by type of admission and release including: new court commitments, paroles, returns on parole violation, discharges, escapes, deaths, transfers to other correctional facilities both within the state and outside of the state, and trips to hospitals and courts.

This report consists primarily of seventeen tables that describe the various types of movement. The first table summarizes changes in population from December 31, 1982 to December 31,1983. The next two tables summarize all types of admissions and releases. The remaining fourteen tables consider specific types of moves in detail. Each table is broken down by specific institution or institutional group.

Offenders can be received into an institution in any number of ways. Offenders can be committed by the courts to Walpole, Concord or Framingham. Only at the time that the offender arrives at that institution is the commitment registered. During 1983 and for several years previous to that it was often the case that, after sentencing, an offender would be placed at a house of correction

(a county facility) while awaiting space at a state facility under the authority of the Department of Correction (DOC). These offenders are not counted as commitments until they actually arrive at the institution of commitment. Offenders can also arrive from another institution to begin serving a new sentence, having finished a first sentence and started a second or third sentence. These are "from and after", "B" and "C" sentences. Generally an offender would be paroled or discharged from the initial sentence and then committed on a second sentence.

Offenders can be admitted in ways that are not directly related to beginning of a new sentence. Offenders who have violated some condition of their parole can be returned as a parole violator to continue serving the sentence on which they were released. Offenders can also be returned from outside releases of short duration such as trips to courts or hospitals or be returned from escape. Additionally, offenders can be transferred from other correctional authorities including houses of correction, federal prison authorities, out-of-state prison authorities, or sheriffs.

Offenders can be released by the authority of the Parole Board, by receiving a good conduct discharge, by serving the maximum term of their sentence, or by obtaining a court-revised sentence. Such paroles and releases can be sent to the community, to another prison authority, or to another sentence. Offenders also can be released on a short term basis to hospitals or courts. Moreover, offenders are classified as released if they die during their incarceration or escape from confinement.

The most common type of movement is a transfer from one facility within the Department to another. Because the Department maintains facilities of different security levels, an offender initially is placed in one of the three commitment institutions (Walpole, Concord or Framingham) and then moved to lower security facilities in the process of serving his/her prison sentence. Such

inter-institutional transfers are generally from a higher security setting to a lower security setting, but occasionally transfers are made from lower to higher security. Each time a movement of this type occurs, one institution records an admission and another institution records a release.

When considering numbers of admissions and releases, this report does more than tabulate the number of offenders admitted from the courts and released by parole or the termination of their sentence. This report includes information on all types of admissions to and releases from each of the institutions in the department and, as such, is a valuable statistical description of the flow of offenders through the correctional system of Massachusetts.

### **Highlights of 1983 Movements**

This section presents an overview of the population movements during 1983 and highlights some of the significant trends. More complete information can be found by consulting the individual tables. In reading the tables in this report, the reader should note that: (1) the top number in each cell in the body of a table represents the number of moves which are characterized by the corresponding row and column categories of that table, and (2) the bottom number in parenthesis in each cell represents the percentage of total moves in that column (column percent) corresponding to the row category. The percents sum down the column to total 100 percent. For example, Table 2 indicates that court commitments comprise 739 admissions or 43 percent of the total admissions to Walpole during 1983. All tables in the text should be read as reporting the admissions, releases, transfers and returns to or from the institutions identified across the top of the tables. Reading the numbers and percentages in this way is consistent with the document's

discussion of the movement information.

Population Changes. At the beginning of 1983 the count of inmates in custody in Massachusetts Department of Correction facilities stood at 4473; at the end of 1983 the population was 4605.\frac{1}{2} This represents an increase of 132 individuals or three percent during the year and an increase of 22 percent over the population at the beginning of 1982. Table 1 summarizes all movements of offenders during 1983. The number of admissions during 1983 was only slightly greater than the number of releases that year. The average number of moves per inmate was three.\frac{2}{2} Over three-fourths (78 percent) of the inmates in custody logged up to three moves during the year; five percent logged six or more moves.

Inter-institutional transfers comprised the majority of admissions and releases, 74 percent and 76 percent, respectively. Of the population transferred between institutions, inmates averaged two moves apiece. Only about one percent of all moves were releases to and returns from hospitals for medical purposes. However, the 336 inmates making hospital moves in 1983 averaged one move to a community or DOC hospital during the year; the actual number of hospital moves ranged from a low of one to a high of eleven moves. The majority of hospital moves were transfers to the secure ward of Lemuel Shattuck Hospital.

The figures 4473 and 4609 do not include individuals sentenced to the Department and awaiting placement at the time the counts, women awaiting trial at MCI-Framingham, or inmates in custody at Bridgewater State Hospital. However, DOC inmates in Houses of Correction at the time of the counts are included in the initial and year-end population figures, and their moves during the year are reported.

This practice may overestimate the average number of moves per inmate because a transfer between institutions is counted as two moves. To adjust for double counting in averaging the number of moves per inmate, a release from one institution and transfer to another has been counted as a single move.

Admissions. There was a total of 11,988 admission movements of all types into institutions during 1983. This represents a six percent increase in admissions over the number of such movements in 1982. The number of returns on parole violations in 1983 was 404, a five percent decrease from the previous year. There were 8,907 admissions that were transfers from other Department of Correction facilities, an eight percent increase from the previous year. New court commitments remained about the same in the two-year period; there were 1,968 commitments in 1982 and 1,965 in 1983. New court commitments do not include offenders awaiting placement in a DOC facility (two at the end of 1983), nor offenders re-admitted on a "from and after" sentence. The number of individuals received on a from and after sentence increased from 39 in 1982 to 70 in 1983. Moreover, returns from escape increased by 18 percent compared to the previous year. There were 251 returns from escape in 1982 and 296 in 1983.

Releases. There were 11,856 movements out of institutions during 1983, an 11 percent increase from the previous year. Much of the increase in releases can be attributed to relatively more paroles to the street, which increased by 47 percent in one year from 957 paroles in 1982 to 1,406 in 1983. The number of transfers to houses of correction remained about the same (79 in 1982 and 84 in 1983). There were 9 deaths in Department of Correction facilities during the year. One death was by homicide, three were by suicide, and five by natural causes. The number of escapes decreased from 275 escapes in 1982 to 257 in 1983.

Court Commitments. There were 1,965 new court commitments during 1983. While total new court commitments remained virtually the same in 1982 and 1983 (1,968 and 1,965, respectively), the distribution of the commitments among the

three commitment institutions varied over the two years. The number of commitments to Walpole increased only slightly by three percent; the number of commitments to Concord decreased by 15 percent from 715 in 1982 to 606 in 1983; and the number of commitments to Framingham increased by 16 percent from 532 in 1982 to 620 in 1983. The total court commitments for 1983 equal the sum of the 1,965 "new" court commitments plus the 70 "from and after" sentences of inmates already under the authority of DOC. New commitments and "from and after" commitments amount to 2,035 total court commitments in 1983.<sup>3</sup>

Institutional Transfers. From 1982 to 1983 there was an increase of eight percent in inter-institutional transfers. Two institutions, Walpole and Concord, accounted for almost half (49 percent) of the transfers sent out. Concord and Norfolk were the largest receivers of institutional transfers. With the exception of Concord, most of the transfers released from medium security institutions such as Framingham, Norfolk, Gardner and SECC were sent to lower security institutions. Excluding the transfers to Bridgewater and Lemuel Shattuck, 59 percent, 75 percent and 45 percent of the releases from Norfolk, Gardner and SECC, respectively, went to minimum security or pre-release facilities in 1983. Three-fourths (76 percent) of Bay State releases and 59 percent of NECC releases went to pre-release facilities; both Bay State and NECC are minimum security institutions. While 50 percent of the releases from pre-release and minimum security insti-

tutions were moves to other low security facilities, two-thirds (66 percent) of the admissions to lower security facilities came from walled institutions, including Walpole, Concord, Norfolk and Gardner.

Among the lower security institutions, four facilities house both minimum security and pre-release offenders: MCI-Plymouth, MCI-Warwick, MCI-Lancaster, and MCI-Shirley. For the sake of consistency with past movement reports, MCI-Plymouth and MCI-Warwick have been classified as minimum security institutions and MCI-Shirley and MCI-Lancaster have been classified as pre-release facilities. This classification of mixed security institutions should be kept in mind when examining Table 9. The information in Table 9 indicates that MCI-Shirley, MCI-Lancaster and Massachusetts Halfway Houses (contract facilities) received the majority of admissions to pre-release facilities in 1983. Likewise, most of the releases from pre-release centers came from Massachusetts Halfway Houses (28 percent). MCI-Shirley (24 percent), and MCI-Lancaster (15 Approximately 50 percent of all releases from pre-release centers in 1983 were transfers to other DOC facilities; 35 percent were paroles to the street; and 10 percent were escapes.

Hospital Transfers. Offenders needing hospital care can be treated at various community hospitals or Lemuel Shattuck Hospital, a hospital at which the Department of Correction maintains a secure ward for offenders in custody. During 1983 there were 358 transfers to Lemuel Shattuck Hospital from Department of Correction facilities (Table 5) and 364 returns from Lemuel Shattuck to state correctional institutions (Table 6).

There were 77 releases to community hospitals (Table 10). Together Framingham Union, Brigham and Women's, Massachusetts Eye and Ear, and

New England Medical Center received approximately 60 percent of the community hospital releases. Of the 74 returns to correctional institutions from outside hospitals, 62 percent came from Framingham Union, Massachusetts Eye and Ear, Brigham and Women's, and New England Medical Center (Table 11).

Transfers to Houses of Correction. Four types of movements between county houses of correction and state facilities are presented in Tables 12 through 15 of this report. The first type of move involves a Department of Correction inmate transferring to a county institution to serve or finish serving a sentence. There were 84 such transfers in 1983. The Springfield House of Correction received the largest number of transfers (17) during 1983. The second type of move is a Department of Correction inmate returning from a county facility. There were 41 such returns in 1983. About two-thirds of the returns (26) went back to Concord. The third type of move is the admission of a county inmate to a Department of Correction facility. There were 15 such admissions in 1983, a decrease from 36 in 1982. The fourth type of move is the release of a Department of Correction inmate to a county facility on a "from and after" sentence. There were 29 such releases in 1983 which showed little change from 1982. Most of the releases went to the Suffolk County facility at Deer Island or Billerica House of Correction (20 moves altogether).

Movements to Other States. There were 98 transfers from Department of Correction facilities to prisons in other states. This included 81 Department of Correction inmates and 17 interstate transfers under the jurisdiction of other states. Most of these offenders (71 percent) were released from Walpole, Norfolk and Gardner. Almost 85 percent of these offenders were transferred to other New England states. There were 116 admissions from other states during 1983. Inmates

admitted from out-of-state prisons included 84 Department of Correction offenders and 32 offenders under the jurisdiction of other states. Most of these offenders were sent from other New England states (84 percent) and admitted most often to Norfolk, Walpole, Framingham or Concord.

#### Glossary

- 1. Gardner is the North Central Correctional Institution, sometimes referred to as NCCI.
- 2. SECC is the Southeastern Correctional Center.
- 3. NECC is the Northeastern Correctional Center.
- 4. Forestry consists of two minimum security forestry camps at Plymouth and Warwick.
- 5. Drug Rehab/Drug Rehabilitation programs are pre-release centers for offenders with drug related problems. Drug Rehab includes the following programs: Spectrum House, Meridian House, Boston VA Hospital.
- 6. Lemuel Shattuck Hospital provides a secure ward for offenders requiring treatment.
- 7, Bridgewater State Hospital includes the hospital for the criminally insane and sexually dangerous persons (SDP Treatment Center).
- 8. MHHI (Massachusetts Halfway Houses, Incorporated) is a private non-profit corporation that provides facilities to DOC on a contract basis. MHHI includes the following facilities: 577 House, Coolidge I, Temporary Housing Project (THP), Coolidge II, and Brooke House.
- 9. The Medfield Prison Project is a minimum security facility located on the grounds of the Medfield State Hospital.
- 10. M.C.I. refers to Massachusetts Correctional Institution.
