RESOLUTIONS

On the Passing of Councillor John C. F. Slayton.

1 *Resolved*, That the senate of Massachusetts receives
2 the announcement, by his excellency the governor, of
3 the passing of the honorable John C. F. Slayton, coun-
4 cillor from the fourth district, with profound regret. The
5 late councillor had attained a very high place in commer-
6 cial and philanthropic circles. His generousities and
7 charities had won for him not alone the love and regard
8 of his own constituency, but the respect of the people of
9 the commonwealth wherever he was known. His broad-
10 minded and large-hearted qualities as a citizen, business
11 man and public servant have always inspired confidence,
12 respect and affection. The senate records its high appre-
13 ciation of the late councillor and its regret that the
14 commonwealth should so suddenly be deprived of his
15 valuable services.
