## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two.

### AN ACT

To authorize the Boston Protective Department to Pension its Employees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section one of chapter two hundred and thirty-  
2 three of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and  
3 four is hereby amended by striking out all after  
4 the word "than", in the tenth line and inserting  
5 in place thereof the following:— twenty-five  
6 consecutive years and who is fifty-five years of  
7 age or over.

8 In case of permanent incapacity from injuries  
9 received in the actual performance of duty, the  
10 annual pension shall be an amount not exceeding  
11 two thirds of the compensation which the injured  
12 employee was receiving at the time of his retire-

13 ment, except that a member of the auxiliary  
14 force shall receive an amount not exceeding two  
15 thirds of the compensation payable in the regular  
16 fifth grade.

17 The compensation of employees who are re-  
18 tired after having served twenty-five or more  
19 years, as aforesaid, and after reaching the age  
20 of fifty-five years shall be an amount not exceed-  
21 ing one half of their compensation at the time of  
22 retirement."
