

SENATE No. 194

To accompany the petition of Walter C. Myers relative to the compensation of certain members of boards and commissions and other employees of the Commonwealth. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two.

AN ACT

Relative to the Salaries of Certain Members of Boards and Commissions, and Other Employees of the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. On and after June first, of the
2 present year, the compensation of heads of de-
3 partments and other employees and members of
4 boards and commissions of the commonwealth,
5 shall be reduced as follows:—
- 6 Those receiving an annual salary of three thou-
7 sand dollars to three thousand five hundred dol-
8 lars, five per cent reduction.
- 9 Those receiving an annual salary of three thou-
10 sand five hundred dollars to five thousand dol-
11 lars, ten per cent reduction.

12 Those receiving an annual salary of five thou-
13 sand dollars to seven thousand five hundred dol-
14 lars, fifteen per cent reduction.

15 Those receiving an annual salary of seven thou-
16 sand five hundred dollars and over, twenty-five
17 per cent reduction.

1 SECTION 2. The members of the armory com-
2 mission, the art commission, the ballot law com-
3 mission, board of bar examiners, board of dental
4 examiners, board of registration in embalming,
5 and the members of all other boards or commis-
6 sions of the commonwealth who meet on official
7 business less frequently than once in every two
8 weeks during the year, shall be paid at the rate
9 of eight dollars for each meeting so attended;
10 and in no case shall the annual aggregate com-
11 pensation of said members exceed four hundred
12 dollars.

1 SECTION 3. The compensation of the trustees
2 of the Boston Elevated Railway Company is
3 hereby fixed at five dollars for each meeting which
4 they attend on official business; and in no case
5 shall the aggregate annual compensation of said
6 trustees exceed twenty-five hundred dollars.

1 SECTION 4. The provisions of sections two and
2 three shall take effect upon passage of this act.
