

SENATE No. 224

To accompany the petition of John P. Englert relative to the construction of three family apartment houses in the city of Boston. Metropolitan Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two.

AN ACT

To authorize the Construction of Three-family Dwellings within Certain Territory of the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 It shall be lawful to build three-family dwell-
2 ings, known as "frame houses", within the bound-
3 aries of the sixth Suffolk senatorial district, not-
4 withstanding the provisions of chapter five hun-
5 dred and fifty of the acts of nineteen hundred and
6 seven. Said three-family dwellings shall comply
7 with the building laws pertaining to buildings
8 known as three-family frame houses.
