AN ACT

Authorizing the Town of Belchertown to incur Indebtedness for Schoolhouse Purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of acquiring land
2 for, and the construction of school buildings, and
3 of originally equipping and furnishing the same,
4 the town of Belchertown may from time to time
5 borrow such sums as may be necessary, not ex-
6 ceeding in the aggregate forty thousand dollars,
7 and may issue bonds or notes therefor, which
8 shall bear on their face, the words Belchertown
9 School Loan, Act of 1922. Each authorized
10 issue shall constitute a separate loan. Indebted-
11 ness incurred under this act shall be in excess of
12 the statutory limit, but shall, except as herein
13 provided, be subject to chapter forty-four of the
14 General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
