## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two.

### AN ACT

Establishing the Salaries of Assistant Registers of Deeds.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter thirty-six of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out section thirty-  
3 six and inserting in place thereof the following:—  
4 *Section 36.* Except as otherwise provided, the  
5 salaries of assistant registers shall be sixty per  
6 cent of the salary of the register of their respec-  
7 tive districts and shall be paid by their respective  
8 counties. In the county of Suffolk the salary of  
9 the assistant register shall be fifty-five per cent  
10 of the salary of the register and shall be paid by  
11 said county.
