## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two.

### AN ACT

Relative to the Salaries and Retirement Allowances of the Present Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The present chief justice of the  
2 supreme judicial court shall receive a salary of  
3 twelve thousand five hundred dollars and each  
4 of the present associate justices of said court shall  
5 receive a salary of twelve thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. Said chief justice and associate  
2 justices shall likewise be entitled to the benefits  
3 of sections sixty-one and sixty-two of chapter  
4 thirty-two of the General Laws, except that their  
5 retirement allowances thereunder shall be based  
6 upon the salaries received by them next prior to  
7 the passage of this act.
