The committee on Bills in the Third Reading to whom was referred the Resolve authorizing an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to establishing a public reservation near the Charles River Bridge connecting Boston and Dedham (Senate, No. 273), report recommending that the same be amended by substituting therefor a New Draft entitled a "Resolve authorizing an investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to acquiring land for park purposes near the Spring Street Bridge, so-called, connecting Boston and Dedham, and the erection and maintenance thereon of facilities for public boating and bathing." Resolve authorizing an Investigation by the Metropolitan District Commission relative to acquiring Land for Park Purposes near the Spring Street Bridge, so-called, connecting Boston and Dedham, and the erection and maintenance thereon of facilities for Public Boating and Bathing.

1 *Resolved*, That the metropolitan district commis-
2 sion is hereby authorized and directed to investigate
3 and report as to the feasibility, desirability and
4 probable cost of acquiring by eminent domain, pur-
5 chase or otherwise, land on both sides of the Charles
6 river adjacent to the Spring street bridge, so-called,
7 connecting Boston and Dedham, such land to con-
8 stitute a reservation under its control, and the erec-
9 tion and maintenance of such reservation of
10 facilities for public boating and bathing.

11 Said commission shall submit its report and
12 recommendations, accompanied by plans, estimates
13 and drafts of any proposed legislation, to the gen-
14 eral court not later than the first Wednesday in
15 January, nineteen hundred and twenty-six. The
16 commission, subject to the approval of the governor
17 and council, may expend for the aforesaid purposes
18 such sums, not exceeding five hundred dollars, as
19 may be appropriated by the general court.
