In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Five.

An Act authorizing the Appointment of Additional  
Patrolmen in the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The police commissioner of the city of Boston  
2 may, during the current year, with the approval  
3 of the governor and council, appoint such addi-  
4 tional patrolmen as members of the police de-  
5 partment of said city, not exceeding one hundred,  
6 as he may deem necessary. The appointment,  
7 compensation and tenure of office of such patrol-  
8 men shall be subject to the provisions of chapter  
9 two hundred and ninety-one of the acts of nine-  
10 teen hundred and six, and acts in amendment  
11 thereof or in addition thereto, except that such  
12 appointment shall not be subject to the approval  
13 of the mayor of the city of Boston.
