

To accompany the petition of Edward J. Cox relative to the marking of certain horse-drawn vehicles used for commercial purposes on the highways. Highways and Motor Vehicles.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Six.

An Act relative to the Marking of Certain Horse-drawn Vehicles used for Commercial Purposes on the Highways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Every horse-drawn vehicle while
2 in use for commercial purposes on any highways
3 in the commonwealth, excluding vehicles in the
4 nature of farm or road machinery, and excluding
5 vehicles used for the transportation of hay or
6 grain raised by the owner or user of the vehicle,
7 shall have plainly and conspicuously marked on
8 both sides thereof, in letters not less than one and
9 one half inches high, the name of the owner of
10 said vehicle.

1 SECTION 2. Violation of the provisions of this
2 act shall be punished by a fine of not less than
3 three nor more than one hundred dollars.
