An Act establishing the Minimum Compensation for Members of Certain Police Departments who have served therein for Five Years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
3 section twenty-one, under the heading Compensa-
4 tion of Local and Metropolitan Police, the follow-
5 ing new section:—

6 *Section 21A.* The members of the police force
7 of the metropolitan district commission, who have
8 served therein for five years, and in cities, except
9 Boston, and in towns whereof the police depart-
10 ment is subject to chapter thirty-one, which accept
11 this section not later than the year nineteen hun-
12 dred and twenty-seven, the members of the police
13 department who have served therein for a like
14 period, shall receive a minimum compensation of
15 six dollars per diem.
