

Accompanying the second recommendation of the Metropolitan District Commission (House, No. 62). Metropolitan Affairs. Dec. 2, 1926.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act to provide a General Office and Headquarters Building for the Metropolitan District Commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission is
2 directed to acquire land in the city of Boston for a site
3 for a building for general office and headquarters pur-
4 poses of the commission, and to construct a building for
5 these purposes on said land. For the purposes of this act,
6 said commission may take in fee by eminent domain
7 under chapter seventy-nine of the General Laws, or ac-
8 quire, by purchase or otherwise, such land as may be
9 necessary, and may expend therefor a sum not exceeding
10 six hundred thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act, the state
2 treasurer may borrow on the credit of the common-
3 wealth such sums, not exceeding in the aggregate six
4 hundred thousand dollars, as may from time to time be
5 required, and may issue and renew notes of the common-
6 wealth, carrying such rates of interest as the state treas-
7 urer may fix, with the approval of the governor and coun-

8 cil, such notes to be for such term or terms as shall be
9 recommended by the governor in pursuance of section
10 three of Article LXII of the amendments to the consti-
11 tution. The interest and principal requirements on ac-
12 count of such notes shall be apportioned, assessed and
13 collected as follows: one third as maintenance of reser-
14 vations by the metropolitan parks district; one third as
15 maintenance by the metropolitan water district; and
16 one third in equal parts each as maintenance by the
17 north and south metropolitan sewerage districts.
