

Accompanying the fourth recommendation of the Metropolitan District Commission (House, No. 62). Metropolitan Affairs. Dec. 2, 1926.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act relative to the Construction of Cottage Farm Bridge and Certain Other Bridges over the Charles River Basin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the cost of construction of the new Brookline
2 street—Essex street—Cottage Farm bridge and its ap-
3 proaches, authorized by chapter four hundred and ninety-
4 seven of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and
5 twenty-one and acts in addition thereto and in amend-
6 ment thereof, including the work authorized under section
7 two of chapter three hundred and twenty-seven of the
8 acts of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six, the
9 metropolitan district commission may expend a further
10 sum not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand dol-
11 lars in addition to the amounts heretofore authorized.
12 Pursuant to this act, the state treasurer may borrow on
13 the credit of the commonwealth such further sums, not
14 exceeding in the aggregate one hundred and fifty thou-
15 sand dollars, as may from time to time be required, and
16 may issue and renew notes of the commonwealth, carry-
17 ing such rates of interest as the state treasurer may fix,
18 with the approval of the governor and council, said notes

19 to be for such term or terms as shall be recommended by
20 the governor in pursuance of section three of Article
21 LXII of the amendments to the constitution. The addi-
22 tional construction cost incurred under the provisions of
23 this section, including interest, shall be determined and
24 assessed in accordance with the provisions of section five
25 of said chapter four hundred and ninety-seven of the
26 acts of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-one, rela-
27 tive to the Essex street-Brookline street-Cottage Farm
28 bridge and approaches.
