The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

Resolve establishing the Connecticut Valley Regional Planning Board.

1 *Resolved*, That a special unpaid commission, to be
2 known as the Connecticut Valley regional planning
3 board, and to consist of a county commissioner from
4 each of the counties of Hampden, Hampshire and Frank-
5 lin, to be designated by the governor, and four other
6 persons, one of whom shall be a landscape engineer
7 and another a civil engineer, both of established reputa-
8 tion, to be appointed by the governor, shall consider
9 the report submitted to the general court in 1924 by
10 the Connecticut valley park commission, appointed
11 under chapter sixty-nine of the resolves of nineteen hun-
12 dred and twenty-three, and shall be entitled to receive
13 all the plans and data compiled by said commission.
14 The commission may incur such expenses for clerical
15 assistance, travel and other expenses as may be ap-
16 proved by the governor and council, within such amount,
17 not exceeding five thousand dollars, as may hereafter
18 be appropriated. The commission shall report the re-
19 sults of its investigation, accompanied by such maps

20 and plans as it may deem useful, to the next general
21 court, on or before the first Wednesday in January,
22 nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and with the sub-
23 mission of said report the existence of said commission
24 shall terminate.
