

By Mr. Osborne of Lynn, petition of Ralph S. Bauer, mayor, that the city of Lynn be authorized to permit the building of a bridge by the J. B. Blood Company over Wheeler Street in said city. Cities. Jan. 18.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act relative to the Building of a Bridge over
Wheeler Street in the City of Lynn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Upon petition, and after seven days'
2 public notice published in at least two newspapers
3 published in the city of Lynn and a public hearing
4 thereon, the city council of the city of Lynn may
5 issue a permit to J. B. Blood Company to build and
6 maintain a bridge across Wheeler street in said
7 city, for the purpose of connecting buildings owned
8 by said company on opposite sides of said Wheeler
9 street.

1 SECTION 2. No bridge built across said Wheeler
2 street under a permit granted as provided in sec-
3 tion one of this act shall be constructed or main-
4 tained at a height less than sixteen feet above the
5 grade line of said street. And no bridge shall be
6 more than twelve feet in width, and no portion of
7 the bridge or its support shall rest on the surface
8 of the street.

1 SECTION 3. Any person whose property is
2 damaged by reason of the construction of a bridge
3 permitted to be built as provided in section one of
4 this act, may have the damages therefor determined
5 by a jury upon petition to the superior court there-
6 for filed within one year after the permit for the
7 erection of such bridge is granted, as provided in
8 section one of this act.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
