In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act authorizing the Town of Falmouth to use for Fire Department purposes a Certain Parcel of Land therein, sometime used for Park purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Falmouth may use for
2 purposes of its fire department a certain parcel of
3 land therein, known as the "Hewins Lot", pur-
4 chased by it in eighteen hundred and ninety-seven
5 for use as a site for a memorial public library, but,
6 after the necessity for such use ceased, used for
7 park purposes.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance by vote of the selectmen of said town;
3 provided, that such acceptance occurs during the
4 current year.
