## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

An Act authorizing the County of Bristol to pay Certain Sums of Money on Account of the Death of Charles Walker, an Officer of its Prison Camp in the City of Attleboro.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of promoting the public  
2 good, the county of Bristol may pay to the widow and  
3 minor child, or either of them, of Charles Walker, a  
4 former officer of its prison camp at Attleboro who was  
5 killed while in the performance of his duty by an in-  
6 mate of said camp, the amounts to which the said widow  
7 and minor child, or either of them, would be respectively  
8 entitled if sections sixty-nine to seventy-five, inclusive,  
9 of chapter one hundred and fifty-two of the General  
10 Laws, as amended, had been in effect in said county at  
11 the time of said death and had provided for compen-  
12 sation in such a case, and subject to the conditions set  
13 forth in section thirty-one of said chapter, as amended.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its ac-  
2 ceptance during the current year by the county com-  
3 missioners of said county.
