Resolve relative to the Claims of Henry Bacon and Daniel
Chester French against the Commonwealth.

1 *Resolved*, That the attorney general is hereby re-
2 quested to investigate the claims of Henry Bacon and
3 Daniel Chester French against the commonwealth, re-
4 ferred to, respectively, in House documents No. 755
5 and No. 756 of the current year, and to find the facts
6 in relation thereto and the amount of the sum or sums,
7 if any, which may be legally due to the said Bacon and
8 the said French, respectively. For the purpose of the
9 investigation herein directed, the attorney general, or an
10 assistant attorney general designated by him, may hold
11 hearings, take evidence, administer oaths and issue
12 subpoenas. The attorney general is hereby further re-
13 quested to make a report of such investigation to the
14 general court by filing such report with the clerk of the
15 house of representatives on or before October fifteenth
16 in the current year, and at the same time to file a copy
17 thereof with the budget commissioner as a part of the
18 budget estimates required to be submitted under section
19 four of chapter twenty-nine of the General Laws.
