Resolve in Favor of the Guardian of Lionel J. Fredette of
South Hadley.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of promoting the
2 public good, and after an appropriation has been made
3 and a guardian appointed for Lionel J. Fredette of
4 South Hadley, a former mechanic in Company E, one
5 hundred and fourth infantry, Massachusetts national
6 guard, there be allowed and paid to the guardian of
7 said Fredette the sum of four thousand dollars in full
8 compensation for disability resulting from the per-
9 formance of military duty with said company on October
10 seventh, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and from
11 further disability, if any, resulting from the performance
12 of military duty with said company at camp Devens
13 during July, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, in
14 accordance with the findings of the attorney general as
15 contained in House document No. 129 of the current
16 year.
